Who are we?



Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung (KAS) developed from the Society for Christian Democratic Educational Work that was founded back in 1955. Since 1964, it has borne the name of the first Federal Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany, Konrad Adenauer. The promotion of liberal democracy and a social market economy, of peace and freedom, transatlantic relations and European unification is what the KAS stands for. Similar to other political foundations, the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung is mostly financed by public funds.
